Dear readers,

since 2010, EATC has been the operational reality for effective pooling and sharing of air mobility assets, uniquely increasing harmonisation, standardisation and interoperability. Today, EATC is a recognized centre of expertise for air mobility and an outstanding cooperative effort of seven nations.

Next year will offer interesting challenges. In 2024, we are looking into A400M Lighthouse Project and air-to-air refuelling training possibilities outside of Europe, in the framework of the world-wide "Pacific Skies" deployment.



A special focus will be put on the Lighthouse Project's cross-activities that are developed further, in particular the sharing of certified staff and of spare parts. Furthermore, EATC is looking into opportunities to extend the project to the A330 and C130J fleet. Through these multinational approaches, EATC demonstrates operational gains and flexibilities for its member nations and partners.

We will also give special attention to aeromedical evacuation. EATC's portfolio includes unique aeromedical evacuation capabilities from all member nations. These single pieces are pooled within EATC and we will address opportunities to increase our collaborative efforts in order to meet possible future challenges.

In close cooperation with the member nations, EATC will continue to develop progressive ideas to ascertain its role as a unique multinational command and to shape the future of air mobility, including supporting the nations in crisis response scenarios, which are likely to arise in the next years.





AIR-TO-AIR REFUELLING

Today, EATC is considered in Europe as a centre of expertise in the domain of air-to-air refuelling (AAR). Thanks to the implementation of the multinational MRTT unit, the achievement of full AAR capability for the A400Ms and the arrival of new KC-130Js, EATC becomes the major force provider in Europe, with large operational options and reinforced operational effectiveness.



EVACUATION

AEROMEDICAL EATC conducts strategic aeromedical evacuations of injured or ill persons by air assets from anywhere in the world to the patients home country, or to a safe place where appropriate medical care is available. EATC also aims at developing standardised procedures and cross-national certifications.

















The Operational Division plans, tasks and controls air missions on behalf of the member nations both in peacetime and in times of crises.
