FOREWORD BY Dear reades,



Multinational cooperation is more complex and time consuming than pure national processes but it is indispensable! Only cooperative efforts overcome logistical challenges, enhance autonomy and offer smart solutions, especially in areas of scare resources.

Our nations took the right decision in 2010, when they established EATC as a standing common command for air mobility. Today, there is no need to reinvent the wheel when it comes to justifying the unique concept and demonstrating the benefits of EATC. A recent example is the Russian aggression against Ukraine. Since February



2022, EATC has stepped up its efforts to facilitate its member nations' support for Ukraine, including the provision of air-to-air refuelling for NATO's air shielding mission.

2023 will again offer us new interesting challenges. In the light of air mobility, EATC will map out options for supporting coordinated and common mission planning and execution for crisis scenarios even up to homeland and alliance defence. EATC will also implement the first steps to train A400M cross-activities in multinational teams. This "lighthouse" project will set the basis for the development of a fully integrated multinational A400M deployment capability, thus reducing the resource requirements for each of the participating nation.

Together with our member nations, EATC will continue to enforce its collaborative and integrated way of planning, developing, and operating air mobility. Together with its staff, EATC will continiously prove being a success story and a potential "blue print concept" for the European defence architecture.





AIR-TO-AIR REFUELLING

Today, EATC is considered in Europe as a centre of expertise in the domain of air-to-air refuelling (AAR). Thanks to the implementation of the multinational MRTT unit, the achievement of full AAR capability for the A400Ms and the arrival of new KC-130Js, EATC becomes the major force provider in Europe, with large operational options and reinforced operational effectiveness.



AEROMEDICAL EVACUATION

EATC conducts strategic aeromedical evacuations of injured or ill persons by air assets from anywhere in the world to the patients home country, or to a safe place where appropriate medical care is available. EATC also aims at developing standardised procedures and cross-national certifications.




Operations Manual (OM) governing flight operations managed by EATC

A400M cross-exchange of technicians (AXET) framework to facilitate multinational maintenance teams






EATC GOVERNANCE AND STRUCTURE

EATC's steering committees decide by consent. The highest decision level (MATraC) meets at air chiefs level and gives direction to the Commander EATC. The Advisory Group advises the Commander EATC on commonly decided policy.













The Operational Division plans, tasks and controls air missions on behalf of the member nations both in peacetime and in times of crises.



The Functional Division acts as a key enabler to promote common values, organises multinational trainings and fosters the harmonisation of doctrines and procedures among nations.





The Policy & Support Division liaises with external actors. and supports the activities of EATC headquarters.
